## Distinctly Tucson Shopping

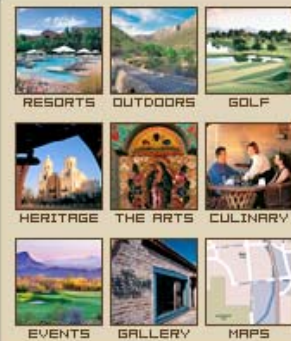
